Hanford Saturday road tours resume

The U.S. Department of Energy invites you to participate in a tour of the Hanford Site. The Saturday road tours will be open to the public and will be offered from July through September.

During the tours, the bus will travel past the old town sites of Hanford and White Bluffs, past former nuclear production reactors, and across the Hanford Site's central plateau. Some of the tours include a stop at B Reactor, the world's first large-scale plutonium production reactor.

Tours are scheduled for the following five Saturdays:

July 10, 7:30-11:30 a.m.

July 24 (including B Reactor), 7:30 a.m.-1:00 p.m.

August 7, 7:30-11:30 a.m.

August 21 (B Reactor), 7:30 a.m.-1:00 p.m.

September 18 (B Reactor), 7:30 a.m.-1:00 p.m.

There is no cost to participate in the tours. Participants must be U.S. citizens and at least 16 years old. Registration for the tours is on a first-come, first-serve basis. Pre-registration for the first tour on July 10 is due by noon on July 1. Subsequent tours will require pre-registration 14 days in advance. When registering, participants must provide their full name, birthdate, and social security number.

On the day of the tour, participants must arrive at the north parking lot of the Federal Building in Richland by 7:30 a.m. for check-in and badging. The Federal Building is located at 825 Jadwin Ave. To receive a badge, participants must present valid photo identification (driver's license, military identification, or passport). The bus will leave promptly at 8:00 a.m. The standard road tour will return at approximately 11:30 a.m.; tours that include a stop at B Reactor will return at approximately 1:00 p.m.

Because of the heightened security on the Hanford Site, strict security guidelines will be enforced. A canine team will inspect all tour buses for explosives prior to beginning the tour. The bus is subject to additional searches at any time during the tour. Tour participants are requested to review the security guidelines on the Hanford tour Web page at <http://www.hanford.gov/tours/saturday.cfm> before registering to participate in a tour. Public tours are subject to cancellation if security conditions change.
