The Contractor exceeded the Department's performance expectations for this performance period receiving an adjectival rating of very good.

Significant Achievements: CSC had many notable accomplishments in FY 2012 including ensuring a high quality medical surveillance program; performing quarterly Epidemiology Surveillances to support RL/ORP worker health and well-being; performing annual Tank Farm Worker Health Analysis Report in support of ORP worker health and well-being; demonstrated understanding of RL/ORP occupational medicine, worker health and well-being priorities; demonstrated focus on quality of care by implementing the two-encounter worker examination and evaluation procedure and responsiveness to worker concerns; and successful implementation of digital x-ray and Picture Archiving Communication System (PACS) resulting in improved care and reduced long-term operation costs.

Minor Deficiencies: CSC has experienced deficiencies in fully implementing an Electronic Medical Records (EMR) system. The implementation of the EMR system occurred at the end of the CSC contract performance period, and just prior to the contract expiration. The Contractor was unable to fully alleviate all of the startup issues before the end of the contract. The system is operational, however, additional work is required to resolve and test some remaining items with this highly customized commercial software system. CSC narrowly missed meeting their Small

Business Goals listed in their FY 2012 Small Business Subcontracting Plan. CSC awarded 65% of their subcontracts to Small Business Concerns, narrowly missing their goal of 70%. CSC exceeded their Small Business Goal for Veteran-Owned Small Business Concerns and with additional outreach efforts, CSC could have met all Small Business Goals.
