

General Information on Travel and Motels

- Lodging -

PLEASE USE THE FORM PROVIDED TO RESERVE A MOTEL ROOM. All the motels are within walking distance of the Conference Center. The Iron County Tourism and Convention Bureau has kindly offered to serve as a one stop shop for motels.

- Travel -

By Air

Cedar City Direct

There is air service to Cedar City through Delta (Sky West) Airlines. You'll probably have to fly to Salt Lake City to make a connection. All the participating motels have shuttle service to and from the airport in Cedar City.

From Salt Lake City

You can fly to Salt Lake City and rent a car. The drive to Cedar on U.S. 15 from Salt Lake City is about 3-4 hours.

From St. George, UT

One option is to fly to St. George, UT from Salt Lake City. A Shuttle in St. George (The Iron County Shuttle) will get you to Cedar City. Or, you can rent a car in St. George and drive up (north) HWY 15 to Cedar City (about 40 minutes).

From Las Vegas, NV

Another option is to fly to Las Vegas. It is sometimes cheaper to fly there and rent a car and drive. However, the drive is about 3 hours. The St. George Shuttle has nine departures daily from the Las Vegas Airport to St. George and the Iron County Shuttle will pick up in St. George and bring passengers to Cedar City. The Shuttle has a web site www.stgshuttle.com (check it out).

By Car

If you are driving to Cedar City, find your way to U.S. 15 that runs north/south through Utah. You can't miss Cedar City as it is a major town on the highway in Southwestern Utah.

- Meals -

All class participants are on their own regarding meals. Refreshments will be served at breaks in the class. There are many restaurants within walking distance of all the motels and the conference center. The University has a cafeteria, but our class is held during the break between the Spring and Summer semesters, so it may not be operating while we are there.

The course's co-host, The Paiute Indian Tribe of Utah, will host a dinner for class participants on the second evening of the course. Information about the dinner and directions to the tribal building will be provided at the course.
