Effective **September 30, 2003**, you *must* register at the Central Contractor Registration (CCR) in order to receive an award, including orders under Multiple Award and Federal Supply Schedule Contracts, from any Federal Agency. This requirement applies to new awards and modifications to existing awards from all Federal Agencies.
