IN HONOR OF AMERICAN VETERANS:

At the conclusion of the groundbreaking ceremony for the Regional Veterans Memorial in Columbia Park ("Local builder's patriotism spawns vets memorial," *Hanford Reach*, May 12), representatives of Veterans of Foreign Wars posts, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Walla Walla District and the Mid-Columbia Girl Scouts Council fold a giant flag that flew from a crane over the crowd of about 200 people. The ceremony took place on Armed Forces Day, May 17, and the Veterans Memorial Committee hopes to have the memorial completed by Veterans Day next November. The huge granite monoliths that will stand in the memorial plaza were donated by the Department of Energy.



WALKING TO WIPE OUT

CANCER: Shirley Myers of Duratek Federal Services Northwest Operations (center) joined more than 870 walkers and runners who braved cold temperatures to participate in the Relay for Life, a 24-hour fund-raiser for the American Cancer Society, held May 17 and 18 at the Southridge High School track in Kennewick. Hanford employees made up 13 of the 58 teams that were registered. At press time, preliminary figures indicate that a total of more than \$101,000 was raised. Of that total, Hanford teams raised more than \$30,000. Kathy Leonard, co-chairman of the Relay for Life and a Battelle employee, indicated that the amount would increase in the next week as funds raised continue to be sent in to the American Cancer Society.
