The BHI equipment was used in the demolition of the building as part of the River Corridor Project's 300 Area skyline initiative. In its early history, the building was used for storing unirradiated fuel, chemicals and uranium scrap, and then became a decontamination facility. Since 1970, it has served as a radioactive and mixed waste storage facility.
