

Compensation Resource Center serves current and past workers

The staff at the Energy Employees Compensation Resource Center would like to remind current and past Hanford workers that they may be eligible to receive compensation for illnesses related to their work in the nuclear weapons industry.

In October 2000, Congress enacted the Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Program Act to provide a \$150,000 lump-sum compensation, as well as related medical expenses, to workers who are seriously ill because they were exposed to radiation, beryllium or silica while working for the Department of Energy, its contractors or subcontractors in the nuclear weapons industry.
