### PUTTING THEIR HEADS TOGETHER FOR BULTENA:

When PFP radiation control technician Dena Bultena was scheduled for chemotherapy for breast cancer, her workmates rallied with a "bald is beautiful" campaign to show their support. The movement quickly grew to become a fundraiser for the Tri-Cities Cancer Center. During the event on May 30, individuals waving \$100 bills contributed by their work groups approached the shearing stations manned by five volunteer "barbers." At the \$700 level, PFP Director Bob McQuinn spurred the forces on with an announcement that he would go bald when the total reached \$1,000, which quickly came to pass. Sax, deputy director of PFP, upped the ante and found himself bald at \$1,500. Radiation Control Manager Rob Cantwell had his haircut interrupted by a drill and had to wait awhile to lose one strip of hair left on top. One woman, scientist Susan Jones, took the "bald is beautiful" risk along with the men. The \$1,600 raised will be donated in Bultena's name to the Cancer Center to be used for women's services.
