Hanford Site Bus Tour Schedule - Wednesday, April 18, 2012

Buses will depart **2 hours apart** from one another. The first bus is scheduled to leave at 7:30 a.m. Participants will be informed of which bus they have been assigned to prior to the tour. **Please arrive at TRAC 30 minutes early** to ensure enough time for security badging. Valid photo identification is required the day of the tour. No cell phones, cameras, or other recording devices are allowed on the tour bus. Each tour is approximately 5 hours in duration. Restrooms will be available on the buses. Light snacks and bottled water will be provided.

Please note: Clothing for participation in the tour must be appropriate for an industrial environment. Anyone not dressed appropriately will not be allowed on the tour. Closed-toed shoes are **MANDATORY**. Sandals, flip-flops, thongs, or open toe/open heel, or high heel shoes are prohibited. Short sleeve shirts, knee-length shorts, or "capris" are acceptable but skirts and sleeveless shirts are not allowed. Long pants are encouraged and highly recommended. Please note that some of the facility briefings are held outdoors, so please dress accordingly. Also, the temperature in the B Reactor can be cool during the spring months. Jackets are recommended.

AGENDA:

Depart TRAC via Motor Coach Bus

All tour participants will board buses at the TRAC. A Hanford employee will provide a guided tour of the Hanford Site, which includes an overview of Hanford's role in the nation's defense effort during World War II and the Cold War, as well as information on today's environmental cleanup mission. The tour route includes a drive by of Hanford's 300 Area where uranium was fabricated into fuel rods; the nine nuclear reactors in the 100 Area located along the Columbia River where the fuel rods were irradiated to produce plutonium for nuclear weapons; and the original Hanford and White Bluffs town sites. Visitors also will have a 75 minute guided walking tour of the historic B Reactor, the world's first full-scale nuclear reactor. Additionally, the tour includes briefings at two Hanford facilities supporting today's cleanup mission :

#1 – Hanford's Plutonium Finishing Plant (PFP)

Hanford's Plutonium Finishing Plant (PFP), which operated from 1949 to 1989, and represented the final step in the plutonium production effort at Hanford, producing hockey-puck sized plutonium buttons and plutonium oxide powder. Workers are now undertaking the monumental challenge of dismantling the PFP complex with the goal of tearing it down by 2015.

#2 – The Waste Treatment Plant, the world's largest facility for turning liquid, radioactive waste into a stable glass form suitable for permanent, safe disposal.

2012 US DOE Bridging Partnerships Small Business Symposium and DOE Small Business Summit Hanford Site Bus Tour Security Guidelines

All tour participants must be at least 18 years of age and U.S. citizens. Valid photo identification is required on the morning of the scheduled tour (i.e., driver's license, military identification, or passport). Items such as credit cards, Costco cards, and library cards will not be accepted as valid identification.

Cell phones, cameras, or other recording devices are not allowed on the tour bus. If an individual is found with any of these items, the tour is subject to immediate termination.

The following items are prohibited articles anywhere on site or in site-associated facilities. If an individual is found with any of these items, the tour is subject to immediate termination:

- Dangerous weapons - Note: Prohibited knives include: blades exceeding four (4) inches in length; spring blade knives or any knife with a blade which is automatically released by a spring mechanism or other mechanical device, or any knife having a blade which opens, or falls, or is ejected into position by force of gravity, or by an outward downward, or centrifugal thrust or movement. Prohibited knives also include machetes, hatchets, axes, straight razors, and similar cutting devices.
- Ammunition
- Explosives
- Incendiary devices
- Controlled substances (e.g., illegal drugs and associated paraphernalia) Note: Prescription drugs in their original containers are not prohibited
- Alcoholic beverages (includes "non-alcoholic" beer and "energy drinks" which identify alcohol as an ingredient)
- Any items prohibited by law
- Pets/animals (except certified guide dogs)

Canine inspections may be conducted by Hanford Patrol prior to the tour bus and occupants entering the Hanford Site. All personnel, vehicles, packages and hand-carried items are subject to search at any time while on the Hanford Site or in associated facilities. The tour bus will only make scheduled stops, or if otherwise directed by Security.

Note: These tours are subject to immediate cancellation any time security conditions for the Hanford Site change, or in the event of other security or safety concerns. In addition, in the unlikely event of an emergency or other unforeseeable situation, the tour bus may be required to remain on the Hanford Site for longer than scheduled. Tour participants should be prepared for such delays. Mission Support Alliance reserves the right to deny access to any Hanford facility or restrict participation on any public tour.
