The Hanford Site will remain in Phase 2 operations during the week of 7 September, continuing the measured and deliberate increase in the work and workforce to safely meet the needs of the Site. COVID-19 protocols that have proven effective in our earlier phases will remain in effect during Phase 2. Site leadership will continue to remain engaged with area officials each week, monitoring local conditions, and make appropriate decisions for the Site in support of the health of the Hanford team and our community.

The Phase 2 designation for Hanford is not the same as the Phase 2 designation for the state. Phase 2 at Hanford provides the opportunity to add necessary work that requires additional use of personal protective equipment now that the supply-chain performance has strengthened.

This year's Labor Day holiday is perhaps more poignant than in years past as we work together to prevent the spread of COVID-19 on the Site and within our community. The first Monday in September, Labor Day, constitutes an annual national tribute to the contributions that workers have made to the strength and prosperity of our country.
