How do we make it permanently known? How do we keep things from losing traction over time? How do things change over time as we learn more? • What are the basic assumptions underlying the land use end state vision? Are they still valid? • From a public perspective, cleanup taking years, hundreds of billions of \$\$, and large pieces of land are not/may not be accessible.....what is driving cleanup?
