

Safety Culture Next Steps

1. Continue to get periodic briefings from SCIPT – progress on action items, contractor engagement, etc.
2. Get update on HSS review

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DS Tanks/Flammable Gas – Next Steps

1. Update after DOE report on tank flow rate monitoring is available (Jan/Feb)
2. Tom w/follow up with concerns about pressurization alarms

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Emergency Preparedness/Response: Input – Strategies for Awareness

1. Use real examples when trying to increase public/HAB awareness (help HAB members to be able to leverage this information to their constituents)  
“Off-site” for HAB members → to give a feel for this
  - Contingencies:
    - Power failure
    - Back up notification system
  - Video of events
  - Communication system
  - Transportation controls
  - Examples of emergency messages/materials
  - “Off-site” for HAB members → to give a feel for this
2. Note: Onsite DOE/States of OR/WA, offsite = counties (coord w/state)

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Emergency Preparedness/Response: Input – Strategies for Awareness (cont'd)

3. Concerns
  - Transportation for employees to get off site
  - Loss of electricity
  - Concern that assumptions are being made that site will be “easily” evacuated
4. Need to help communicate concerns with “self-evacuation” and assoc. dangers
5. Need example of coordinated DOE/Benton Co. event to demonstrate preparedness to public

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Emergency P/R Next Steps

1. Debrief HAB members observations of exercise
  - Identify positives/area for improvement
2. Frame up HAB workshop to talk thru scenarios, tour of EOC with DOE, etc., and materials, messages (counties, DOH)
3. Determination of utility of HAB action

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Follow Up

1. Follow up on topic of how incentives affect safety culture, and appropriate outcomes
2. Pressurization alarms -
  - Tom will check on procedural requirement for press. alarms

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
