

Completed Vault demolition and debris removal. Began 234-5Z main structure demolition.



Continued drilling holes for micropiles that will support the building foundation around the soil excavation zone.



Completed the grout pad demolition test at the mockup facility. This test used remotely-operated equipment to pulverize the grout layer on B-Cell floor.



Designed new shroud to contain dust during drilling. (vacuum capture with HEPA filtration)



Continued removal of geoprobes (pipes) that interfere with the excavation of contaminated soil below B-cell.
