### **Class 1 Modifications to Hanford Site Dangerous Waste Research, Development and Demonstration Permits**

The Washington State Department of Ecology has issued two research, development and demonstration permits at the Hanford Site. One permit is for the NUCON Thermal Oxidation System Phase 3. The other permit is for the 2,000-Gallon Test Bed Initiative demonstration.

The changes described in this notice are Class 1 modifications, which are minor and do not require public comment periods. This notice is intended to fulfill requirements specified under Section I.C of the permits and Washington Administrative Code 173-303-830.

#### **NUCON Thermal Oxidation System Phase 3 Permit Modification:**

- Owner information was updated. Also, facility operational control was transferred from contractor Washington River Protection Solutions to contractor Hanford Tank Waste Operations & Closure.
