Submit the Individual Subcontract Report (ISR) and the Summary Subcontract Report (SSR), in accordance with paragraph I of the clause at FAR 52.219-9 using the Electronic Subcontracting Reporting System (eSRS) at <http://www.esrs.gov>. The reports shall provide information on subcontract awards to SB concerns (including ANCs and Indian tribes that are not SBs), SDB concerns (including ANCs and Indian tribes that have not been certified by SBA as SDBs), WOSB concerns, HUBZone SB concerns, VOSB concerns, SDVOSB concerns, HICUs, and MIs.
