
Implementation of COVID-19 Controls at Hanford's Tank Farms

The Hanford Site is in Phase 2 remobilization as of Aug. 27

- As of beginning of Sept – total number of WRPS employees/workers for the tank farms: 3,200
 - Onsite: approximately 1,500
 - Teleworking: approximately 1,300
 - Nonportable/unable to telework: approximately 300
 - Washington River Protection Solutions COVID-19 cases: 42
- Compared to total number of Hanford Site employees: approximately 10,700
 - Onsite: approximately 6,000
 - Total Site COVID-19 cases: 153
 - Cases are greatly due to exposures out in the community and not onsite
 - These numbers are well below national and state levels due to rigorous controls and a disciplined workforce



Basic control strategies and cultural adjustments include the following:

- Increased depth and frequency of cleaning
- Pre-work health checks
- Social distancing and mandatory face coverings
- Protective barriers and other worksite modifications
- Reconfiguration of conference rooms, kitchens, change trailers, and gathering areas
- Regular engagement with managers to ensure workforce communication and engagement
- Increased reporting and attention on the supply chain to obtain needed consumables

Enhanced Cleaning Protocols




All employees are required to monitor their health. Each day prior to leaving for work, employees shall ask themselves if they have any of the following COVID-19 related symptoms that you cannot attribute to another health condition.

Symptoms of COVID-19 include the following:



- A temperature of 100.4°F or greater
- Cough
- Shortness of Breath
- Fatigue
- Muscle Aches
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Chills
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea






Focus On Safety

Helpful Guidelines to STOP the Spread of Illness

ALARA - Implement a graded approach in your work. Maintain social distancing guidelines to the extent feasible and practical for each situation.

If you become ill while at work, notify your supervisor.

Wash hands frequently using soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Alcohol-based rubs containing at least 60% alcohol may also be used.

Wipe down "high touch" surfaces frequently using approved disinfectant. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for use of all cleaning and disinfection products (e.g., concentration, application, contact time, PPE, etc.)

Keep hands away from mouth, nose and eyes to avoid transferring germs.

Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue, throw tissue away and wash hands

Spread out - Try not to congregate in work rooms, copy rooms or other areas. Keep six feet apart when possible.
